Minister conducts site visits to completed works in St. Madeleine and Mon Repos

August 12, 2019. Kent House, Maraval – Senator the Honourable Haji Kazim Hosein conducted site visits to Clark Street, Ste. Madeleine and Mon Repos, San Fernando, last week (Friday August 9, 2019). Chairman, Mrs. Patricia Alexis, Chief Executive Officer (CEO) and technical team at the Rural Development Company (RDC) along with officials of the Ministry of Rural Development and Local Government were also present on these visits.

The Minister assessed approximately sixty-nine metres (69m) of road paving works with a culvert crossing; a project completed by the Rural Development Company. For decades, this area experienced recurrent flooding. Moreover, the lone access road had not been resurfaced in forty-three (43) years according to the residents who eagerly came out to thank the Minister for all his efforts on their behalf.

Member of Parliament for the area, Randall Mitchell, submitted the road works project to RDC for consideration while drainage works were previously completed by the San Fernando City Corporation in fiscal 2017/2018.

Minister Hosein commended the Executive and Staff of RDC for their hard work and dedication to community development as this particular project was completed in less than two weeks and under budget.

Following this visit, the team proceeded to assess the construction of a pavement along the Naparima Mayaro Road in the vicinity of the Mon Repos Apartments. Minister Hosein was very pleased with the completed project and the efficiency of the Rural Development Company as this was another example of a project that was completed within the allotted timeframe and under budget. This project was seen as essential not only to community development but especially for the women and children who use the pavement on their way to and from work, school and church daily.

As Minister Hosein reminisced on his childhood and growing up in San Fernando, he recalled walking to Naparima College and emphasized how important pavements are especially at a time when the nation's roads are so busy saying, "The safety and security of our children must be our first priority. We have to set the example; firstly, by providing these safe spaces and secondly, by teaching them road and traffic awareness tips. Many road related tragedies can be prevented if persons choose to use pavements and walkovers instead of walking along the roadway or crossing the highway for example."

Minister Hosein further emphasized that participation in decision-making is the cornerstone of development and encouraged citizens to meet with their elected representatives to lobby for projects that require attention in their community; from roads and pavements to bridges and drains, the Ministry puts people first.
